Cross-Cutting Commitment

Diaspora Affairs

The United Progressive Party recognises nationals abroad as Antigua and Barbuda's primary intellectual and economic resource. A UPP government will establish the structures to bring them home - in every sense.

- **Dedicated Portfolio** - Establish within the Office of the Prime Minister the portfolio of Diaspora Affairs, dedicated to cultivating economic and social partnerships with nationals abroad and utilising them as our primary intellectual resource.
- **One-Stop Shop** - Create a single point of contact for advice, direction, and processing of government-related services including investments, land acquisition, and professional opportunities.
- **Retirement Village** - Partner with Diaspora communities to create a secure and self-contained Retirement Village equipped with amenities (ATM, pharmacy, supermarket, recreational facilities, shuttle service) that will make repatriation more desirable.
- **Homecoming Festival** - Reestablish "Homecoming" as part of the Independence festival to promote family, school and community reunions and deepen ties to the land and our culture.

First 100 Days. Fifteen Priorities.

These are the commitments a UPP government begins delivering from day one. Four have an explicit First 100 Days mandate - Education, Healthcare, Energy, and Business & Economy. All fifteen are underway within the first 100 days.

Food First: Survival Before Revenue

Essential Goods · Agriculture · Dollar Barrel · Food Security

The commitment

Remove all taxes, duties, and mark-ups on a redesigned Basket of Essential Goods, strengthen local agriculture through the Central Marketing Corporation, and restore the Dollar Barrel twice yearly.

First 100 Days

- Remove all taxes, duties, and mark-ups on a redesigned Basket of Essential Goods
- Restore the Dollar Barrel initiative twice yearly: June-July and December-January (up to 3 barrels per household per cycle)
- Boost local agricultural production through the CMC with duty-free inputs for farmers
- Maintain existing levies on junk food and sugary drinks - essential nutrition comes first
- Review civil servants' salaries to peg compensation to qualifications
- Upgrade Non-Established workers' salaries to a base of \$2,700 per month

Years 1-3

- Establish bulk-purchase agreements between CMC and government agencies and tourism businesses
- Reduce import dependency on staple food items through targeted agricultural investment
- Expand duty-free input support to cover seeds, fertiliser, and small equipment
- Review and maintain the Essential Goods Basket to reflect what families actually need

- Build a sustainable "Grow What We Eat" strategy connecting local farmers to markets
- Publish a National Food Security Plan with import-reduction targets

Roads & Infrastructure

Accountability, Not Just Asphalt

Roads Commission · Accountability · Community Rehab · Street Naming

The commitment

Establish an Independent Roads Commission, demand a full public accounting of the \$100M road loan and 40% licence-fee hike, and implement a Community Road Rehabilitation Plan built around fairness.

First 100 Days

- Establish an Independent and Professional Roads Commission mandated to monitor all road creation and maintenance
- Review the ABLP's 40% licence-fee hike - demand a full public accounting
- Review the \$100 million road loan - accounting of works completed, contractors paid, value delivered
- Begin the national Street-Naming and House-Numbering Plan to improve emergency response and GPS navigation

Years 1-3

- Implement the Community Road Rehabilitation Plan with community input and needs-based prioritisation
- Repurpose recycled tyres from Cooks Sanitary Landfill for road patching - reducing waste and potholes
- Ensure rehabilitation works are distributed fairly across communities, not politically favoured areas
- Complete the Street-Naming and House-Numbering rollout across all communities

- Move from reactive patching to proactive road maintenance with transparent schedules
- Publish road maintenance schedules by community - residents know when work is planned
- Ensure the Independent Roads Commission has permanent mandate and resources

Vehicle Duties

Relief for Families, Farmers, and Business

The commitment

Make personal vehicles up to 7 years old 100% duty-free. Commercial vehicles will benefit from 50% less duties. Farm vehicles and equipment fully exempt from import duties.

First 100 Days

- Make personal-use vehicles up to 7 years old 100% duty-free
- Commercial vehicles will benefit from 50% less duties
- Fully exempt all designated farm vehicles and equipment from import duties
- Review the ABLP's 40% vehicle-licensing fee hike

Years 1-3

- Establish clear guidelines for personal, commercial, and farm vehicle duty categories
- Ensure the farm vehicle exemption covers a broad range of agricultural equipment
- Monitor impact of vehicle-duty relief on affordability and adjust as needed
- Align vehicle duty policy with the broader agricultural and small-business support agenda

- Conduct a full review of the vehicle-duty relief framework
- Expand the farm equipment exemption as the agricultural sector grows
- Maintain commitment to keeping vehicle costs manageable for working families and businesses

From Scarcity to Security: The WATA Programme

The commitment

Launch the WATA (Water Tanks and Accessories) Programme within the first 100 days, connect all unconnected storage tanks, and enforce a National Schedule of Water Delivery.

First 100 Days

- Launch the WATA (Water Tanks and Accessories) Programme - capitalizing on the July-December rainy season
- Connect and commission all storage tanks erected under previous UPP administrations that remain unconnected
- Deploy emergency-response teams for all reported water leaks across the network
- Enforce a National Schedule of Water Delivery so every community knows when water is coming
- Prioritize maintenance of Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants and maintain adequate spare parts inventory

Years 1-3

- Accelerate new pipe-laying on a community-by-community completion basis - finish one before starting the next
- No more half-done projects that leave communities waiting years for completion
- Launch a National Catchment and Conservation programme beginning at the primary school level
- Expand household and community-level water storage capacity through the WATA Programme

Years 3-5

- Build toward reliable, full-capacity water delivery to every community
- Develop a National Water Resilience Strategy addressing long-term supply and climate adaptation
- Make water conservation education a permanent part of the national curriculum

The commitment

Deliver free public education from Kindergarten to A-Level, sponsor CSEC fees in English and Mathematics, expand trades and technical training, and ensure lifelong adult learning.

First 100 Days

- Deliver free public education from Kindergarten to A-Level
- Sponsor CSEC Examination Fees in English and Mathematics for all students
- Reinstate the two (2) per year School Uniform Grant
- Restore the School Meals Programme to its "Nutrition for Learning" objective - sourced from local farmers
- Teacher compensation will be pegged to qualifications in line with the wider public service framework
- Institute electronic and other measures to upgrade school safety and security
- Increase police presence at bus stations during after-school hours to protect students

Years 1-3

- Reform curriculum to include Antigua and Barbuda and Caribbean history, geography, and civics
- Establish Specialized Subject Concentrations: ICT/AI Tools, Performing Arts/Pan, Entrepreneurship, Trades & Technical Skills
- Establish Trades & Skills Training Centres - construction, renewable energy, manufacturing, culinary arts, clothing design
- Complete 100% broadband connectivity across all schools - no rural school without internet
- Institute Adult Education Evening Classes utilising the secondary school plant nationwide
- Launch Community-Based Courses: Finance Management, Parenting, Health & Wellness, Entrepreneurship, Civic Leadership
- Revamp the Board of Education Scholarship Programme - align with National Priority List and Bonding Requirements

- Expand and support daycare and pre-school education in collaboration with the Church Associations
- Place trained guidance counsellors and mental health professionals in every school zone
- Ensure continuous lifelong learning for adults is embedded as a permanent feature

The commitment

Reopen community clinics beginning with All Saints Clinic, reinstate night clinic services, establish the Cynthia Boone Thibou Senior Centre, and expand mental health services for young people.

First 100 Days

- Accelerate work on reopening All Saints Clinic
- Reinstate night clinic services so working families can access care outside business hours
- Institute a one-year bond for medical scholarship recipients - deployment to community clinics minimum six hours per day, three days per week
- Begin stakeholder consultation to improve care at Mount St. John's Medical Centre with MBS, Nurses and Doctors Associations, and regional institutions

Years 1-3

- Establish the Cynthia Boone Thibou Senior Centre - dedicated space for elderly enrichment and engagement
- Expand mental health services at Clare Vue Psychiatric Hospital including outpatient counselling for young people
- Establish Zonal Wellness Programmes in partnership with churches, schools, Rastafarian communities and sports teams
- Legislate for Integrative and Holistic Medicine with emphasis on preventative care
- Improve Sanitation nationally, starting with St. John's City
- Develop a national marine environment strategy to protect coral reefs and coastal ecosystems - with particular focus on Barbuda's internationally significant marine environment
- Implement a coordinated national response to the sargassum crisis affecting Barbuda and Antigua - collection, safe disposal, and exploration of commercial uses including fertiliser and construction materials
- Establish a responsible coastline investment framework for Barbuda and Antigua that protects natural and marine environments while enabling sustainable economic development along the coast

- Ensure every constituency has a functioning clinic with qualified staff
- Build out a prevention-first healthcare culture through Zonal Wellness Programmes
- Create a sustainable model for community-based mental health support

Build a pro-jobs economy with a one-stop business registration shop, fast-track investment approvals, procurement access for MSMEs, and stronger youth training and apprenticeship pathways.

First 100 Days

- Improve ease of doing business through a one-stop shop for business registration and electronic filing
- Fast-track private-sector investment projects that create jobs and productive activity
- Review Special Economic Zone agreements to ensure they serve the national interest
- Revitalize the Antigua and Barbuda Investment Authority to attract job-creating investment

Years 1-3

- Support entrepreneurship and small-business growth as a job-creation strategy - especially for young people
- Restore a stronger procurement pathway for MSMEs
- Administrative support through the YES Program
- Expand credit, concession and incubator support for productive local business
- Promote well-paying local employment in major projects - first preference for Antiguan and Barbudans

Years 2-5

- Build stronger training and apprenticeship pathways through the School of Careers and employer partnerships
- Support youth innovation centres, start-up capital, business mentoring and enterprise programmes

The commitment

Transform policing into a community-centred service, establish a Civilian Review Board, fast-track justice for violent offences, expand youth diversion, and put prevention at the heart of every parish.

First 100 Days

- Rename the police force as the Antigua and Barbuda Police Service
- Establish a Civilian Review Board with independent authority to review misconduct and use-of-force complaints
- Identify a dedicated revenue stream for training and equipment to improve crime-fighting competencies
- Implement merit-based rewards for police officers, fire officers and nurses - with insurance coverage for all three
- Develop a Community Relations Unit engaging schools, sports teams, churches and regular community patrols
- Create and enforce public order policies at bus stations and on school compounds
- Improve water provision via hydrants for firefighting in St. John's and rural communities
- Re-establish Magistrates' Courts in All Saints, Bolans, Parham and Barbuda

Years 1-3

- Launch Youth Opportunity Programme: job training in carpentry, plumbing, ICT, hospitality, maritime, renewable energy, construction
- Establish a Victim and Witness Support Unit with trauma counselling and court navigation
- Create confidential reporting mechanisms - online, phone and text-based
- Deploy drug and gang-interruption programmes with a dedicated task force and peer-led street outreach
- Establish first-responder centres in Johnson's Point, Carty's Hill and English Harbour

Years 2-5

- Expand youth diversion through the Police Service - reduce unnecessary criminalisation
- Introduce alternative sentencing for eligible non-violent cases
- Build a modern Youth Offender Development Centre and improve the Boys Training School
- Provide skills training, pre-release counselling and post-release re-entry support
- Expand prosecutorial capacity to clear backlogs and deliver timely outcomes for victims

Grow What We Eat, Earn What We Grow

The commitment

Make Diamonds Estate and Christian Valley productive again through rent-free allotments, refocus the CMC on local produce distribution, secure grant funding for solar drying facilities, and protect farmers with stronger praedial larceny laws and long-term land leases.

First 100 Days

- Make Diamonds Estate and Christian Valley fruitful again through rent-free 25-year allotments to farmers
- Refocus the CMC towards marketing and distribution of local produce
- Promote and enforce the 25% reduction in APUA-provided water rates to productive farms
- Increase the penalties for praedial larceny to include suspension of convicted persons' driver's licence for up to one year

Years 1-3

- Actively seek grant funding for the provision and installation of a solar drying/dehydration facility and training in its use and maintenance
- Orient and support farmers toward manufacturing to minimise glut and waste
- Prioritise the creation and improvement of farm roads as a critical part of the Community Roads Rehabilitation Programme incorporating recycled vehicle tyres
- Grant 50-year leases to large-scale productive farmers and allow them to build homes on site to encourage generational continuity and deter praedial larceny

Years 3-5

- Expand the solar drying/dehydration facility programme to serve more farming communities
- Review and extend the rent-free allotment programme based on productivity outcomes
- Build a sustainable farm-to-market pipeline that reduces import dependency on food Antigua and Barbuda can grow

The commitment

Pursue constitutional amendments for dual citizenship electoral rights and fixed-date five-year terms, protect public servants who contest elections, introduce alternative sentencing for first-time non-violent offenders, and mandate counselling for domestic violence offenders.

First 100 Days

- Initiate constitutional amendments to allow nationals with dual citizenship to seek electoral office
- Initiate constitutional amendments to codify fixed-date, five-year electoral terms
- Legislate entitlement of public servants to return to their posts after an unsuccessful bid for electoral office
- Introduce legislation for alternative sentencing - community service for first-time non-violent offenders (probation, not incarceration)
- Mandate counselling and anger-management classes for domestic violence offenders

Years 1-3

- Complete the constitutional amendment process for dual citizenship electoral eligibility
- Complete the constitutional amendment process for fixed-date five-year electoral terms
- Establish and operationalise the community service sentencing framework with oversight and reporting
- Expand counselling and rehabilitation programmes for domestic violence offenders island-wide

- Publish a national audit of constitutional reform progress and remaining priorities
- Build a justice system that prioritises rehabilitation and accountability in equal measure

Sir Vivian Richards Sports & Entertainment Complex - Building Antigua and Barbuda's A

Sir Vivian Richards Sports & Entertainment Complex · Football Stadium · Indoor Sports · North Sound

The commitment

Convert the North Sound location into a Sir Vivian Richards Sports & Entertainment Complex featuring a Football Stadium seating 8,000 patrons and an Indoor Multiple-Purpose Facility for Volleyball, Netball, and Basketball accommodating 5,000 fans - delivered within our first term.

First 100 Days

- Commission the design and development plan for the Sir Vivian Richards Sports & Entertainment Complex at North Sound
- Implement the National Sports Policy and introduce a Sports Development Act
- Mandate the National Sports Council to implement a Code of Ethics for local sporting bodies covering transparency, accountability and good governance
- Create a comprehensive Sports Sponsorship Policy with incentives and concessions to encourage business investment at club and national levels
- Reduce duties on sporting equipment
- Commission a study on the contribution of sports to Antigua and Barbuda's GDP
- Develop a database of all Antiguan and Barbudan athletes who have represented the country and provide necessary support to ensure them an acceptable standard of living

Years 1-3

- Begin construction of the Football Stadium (8,000 capacity) at the Sir Vivian Richards Sports & Entertainment Complex at North Sound
- Begin construction of the Indoor Multiple-Purpose Facility (5,000 capacity) for Volleyball, Netball, and Basketball
- Upgrade the Yasco Track into a National Athletic Centre with an 8-lane Athletic Track
- Establish a High-performance Training Centre for athletes through a public-private partnership
- Assess the need for multi-purpose sports facilities in keeping with the youth development initiatives
- Give special consideration to elite athletes - nutritional, insurance, medical, transportation and accommodation support
- Develop Sports Tourism by marketing Antigua as a high-quality events venue and professional off-season training destination
- Launch Biennial Parish Games and National Under-20 Games covering athletics, cricket, football, netball, basketball and swimming
- Restructure school sports and pay coaches based on their qualifications; increase trained technical staff in all schools
- Implement a Sports For All policy - ensuring sporting and recreational activities are accessible to the elderly and persons with disabilities

- Complete and officially open the Football Stadium and Indoor Multiple-Purpose Facility at the Sir Vivian Richards Sports & Entertainment Complex at North Sound

Establish a National Youth Council with a dedicated Development Policy and budget, guarantee youth representation on all boards, create a National Service Corps, seek grant funding for a new secondary school, and support youth investment through Social Security Win-Win Land Loans.

First 100 Days

- Work with Youth Parliamentarians, UWI-FI, and other civic and church groups to facilitate and support a National Youth Council (NYC) with the Prime Minister as its Patron
- Ensure youth representation on all boards and major committees

Years 1-3

- Collaborate with the NYC to create a Youth Development Policy with a dedicated budget
- Collaborate with the Antigua and Barbuda Defence Force to create a National Service Corps, dedicated to fostering volunteerism in community service
- Within the first term, seek grant and other funding for a new secondary school to reduce overcrowding at Ottos Comprehensive and Princess Margaret Schools
- Encourage youth toward savings and investment by way of the Social Security "Win-Win Land Loans" and dedicated housing programmes
- Conduct a Land Audit to determine the full extent of available Crown land - and establish what has already been sold or swapped
- Zone, price and allocate Crown land in approximately 8,000 sq ft plots at no higher than \$5 per square foot - exclusively for youth aged 35 and under
- Target assignment of plots to no fewer than 2,000 young people over the first term; prohibit bulk acquisition to prevent individuals from buying up Crown land
- End the practice of requiring new homeowners to pay for APUA electricity poles and water pipes when moving into a new neighbourhood
- Pursue public-private partnerships to create affordable, multi-level townhouse communities for young families and first-time buyers

Years 3-5

- Ensure the National Youth Council is fully operational with its own development budget and programme cycle
- Review youth representation on boards and expand the mandate where needed
- Publish outcomes from the National Service Corps and evaluate expansion to new community sectors

Convene industry consultations within the first seven working days, revive the Development Bank, create a \$20,000 business grant fund, launch the Opportunity Knocks programme, repeal the Entertainment Tax, and reduce youth unemployment from 25% to below 10%.

First 100 Days

- Within the first seven working days, liaise with the Chamber of Commerce and Employers Federation to convene a week of consultations with industry leaders, professional associations, and trade unions
- Immediately seek an audience with the US State Department regarding the easing or lifting of visa sanctions on nationals of Antigua and Barbuda
- Review and assess the strengths, weaknesses, and viability of the Citizenship by Investment Program
- Conduct an audit of all State-owned entities, statutory corporations, and companies in which the Government is the major shareholder - including Blue Ocean, NAMCO, National Housing, Ministry of Works, WIOC, and PDV-Caribe
- Repeal the Entertainment Tax and standardize government levies according to size of events
- Revive and recapitalize the Antigua & Barbuda Development Bank by pursuing new investment from local businesses and the Diaspora

Years 1-3

- Create a dedicated fund that supports competitive business ideas - five grants of \$20,000 awarded annually
- Develop and promote the Opportunity Knocks (OK) Program - using skills and trades graduates to rehabilitate abandoned residences that degrade communities
- Support Members of Parliament in creating employment via cultural events and community tourism
- Encourage and promote tours of local manufacturing enterprises
- Facilitate growth for all sectors through private, public, and public-private ventures
- Diversify the economy and reduce over-reliance on Tourism by creating new technology-oriented employment
- Work in close partnership with the Barbuda Council and elected representatives to develop and implement targeted economic development and support programmes for the people of Barbuda

Years 3-5

- Increase the Gross Domestic Product in a responsible manner while controlling the Debt-to-GDP ratio
- Reduce youth unemployment from 25% to below 10%
- Revive Agriculture and reduce the national food import bill; expand manufacturing to add value to natural resources; significantly increase export capacity

Tourism - Years 1-5

- Mandate quarterly meetings between the Tourism Authority and stakeholder representatives
- Incentivize hotels and condo-rentals to expand Tourism into a year-round industry through sustained regional promotion in order to push full-time employment
- Work assiduously to increase Summer airlift into Antigua and greater connectivity into Barbuda
- Restore Sailing Week to its former glory as a premier regatta with the greatest economic spin-offs
- Capitalize on major sporting events, including Test and regional cricket and car-racing, through aggressive marketing
- Assist event promoters in marketing the local "Fete Calendar" to Caribbean neighbours
- Given our passport and geopolitical realities, develop and promote "Staycation: Tourists at Home"
- Work closely with the Barbuda Council to develop a "Know Your Barbuda" tourism campaign
- Urgently clean, sanitize and rehabilitate the City of St. John's, making it pedestrian friendly and attractive for leisure
- Urgently clear, clean and maintain heritage sites and beef up beach security

- Cultivate more "home-grown" experiences (culinary, cultural, ecclesiastical) for cruise visitors to get a better appreciation of our culture and to increase on-island spend
- Cultivate and support young influencers to market the country's smaller properties, entertainment and food via social media
- Assist smaller hotels, inns and Airbnbs to capitalize on the Diaspora market, especially during Independence/Homecoming, Christmas, reunions and funerals
- Accelerate the road-rehabilitation process to assist taxi and tour operators ply their trade more comfortably and efficiently
- Accelerate the Street-Naming and House-Numbering exercise to allow visitors to self-navigate the islands, increasing business for car-rental companies

Debt Settlement - Year 1

- Within the first year, settle 50% of the debt Central Government owes to contractors and vendors
- Convert the remaining balance into a Bond to be paid off within a further year
- Liaise with the Union to settle outstanding severance payments to LIAT (1974) Ltd. and CAS workers

Business Environment

- Proactively work with WIOC, dealers, service-station operators, bus and taxi associations, and other stakeholders to arrive at fuel pricing that is fair to businesses, consumers and Government
- Cabinet Ministers will NOT be permitted to compete with the Business Community
- Assess applications for tax concessions on start-ups, expansions, and acquisitions fairly and professionally - treating local investors with no less consideration than foreign direct investors
- Observe and comply with tendering regulations prescribed by law to stamp out nepotism, cronyism, and the unfair awarding of government contracts for political advantage
- Establish within the first 180 days the Young Entrepreneurs Set-Up (YES) to support fledgling enterprises with advice and administrative support, ensuring young businesses stay in business
- Grant Work Permits on an industry/profession basis instead of being employer-specific - enabling the permit-holder to seek new employment without requiring new documentation
